Dear Madam,

With reference to your letter of 5th instant, I desire to inform you that George Charles Dickson and Robert Hughes were appointed as Bailiffs of Crown Lands on 27th April, 1868, and 13th May, 1890, respectively and such appointments are notified in the Government Gazettes of 5th May, 1868, and 16th May, 1890, respectively.

I desire to add that a search through departmental records from 1867 to date fails to disclose any appointment as a Crown Lands Bailiff of either William Murphy or Martin Kennedy. A certain Constable No. 5340 Martin John Kennedy was appointed as a Bailiff in 1908 but his address is given as Chiltern.
