4. Do you recall a Miss Ramsay, said to be postmistress in 1888/89. Did she work at the hotel for Freeman?

5. All the big area on which the Club hotel stands was sedected by W. K. Ross. Do you think the man who was the cobbler would have had enough to select 294 acs. at fl an acre?

6. On the plan land selected by W. Hughes runs from Thompson's store corner towards Scoresby, about half way down that straight run to Scores Road. It contained 195 acs. Was this Mrs. Sutton's grandfather (the Gran Lodge man) and is this the property Mrs. Sutton refers to as her "Scorest home - as distinct from the place where the store was. I should not think that that bend in the road where Mrs. Sutton's mother had the store would be called Scoresby, so just wonder what she meant by living at "Scoresby. Was Ephraim Hughes the vet? I have it down - did he go on doing his job vet. while Mrs. kept the store?
